### **YARD WASTE DISPOSAL**

Town of Grand Rapids residents may again purchase a season long, annual pass for the compost site. Passes may be purchased at the Municipal Building, The Store, (4010 80<sup>th</sup> St. S.) and by mail. The cost at the Municipal Building and at The Store will be \$37 and by mail \$38. If you wish to have a pass mailed to you, please submit the \$38, your name, address and the license number of the vehicle that will be hauling the compost. We cannot mail you a pass without all of this information.

Yard waste shall include grass clippings, leaves, pine needles, garden waste, and brush.

### HOME EMERGENCY LOCATION PROGRAM

The Grand Rapids Volunteer Fire Department is working to improve the efficiency of emergency response in your area. In the case of an emergency, a rapid response can be critical to ensure the safety of life and property. Too often time is lost locating a residence in need of help. Due to the difficulty of reading address signs because of darkness or inconsistent placement of these signs, your fire department is offering reflective signs to be placed as visibly as possible near the entrance of your property. The difference in saving lives and property may be the proper identification of your address. Dog Licenses are required in the Town of Grand Rapids and available at the Municipal Building.  
Anyone having more than 2 dogs must apply for a "Dog Exemption Permit".  
Dog Licenses expire on March 31<sup>st</sup> and Dog Exemption Permits now expire March 31 also.

Credit and debit cards are now accepted for payment of fees, fines, permits or taxes at the Grand Rapids Municipal Building. The Town has contracted with GovPay to process the payments which is done at no cost to the town. A fee is charged to the person using the credit or debit card based on the amount being charged and/or the type of payment. Over the phone payment can also be accepted. You may inquire at the Municipal Building for more information.

## UPDATE FROM THE CHAIRMAN

2013 was a year with a lot of changes within our township. The good news is that we were able to keep within our budget. The town ended the year with just under \$800,000.00 on hand.

The road project for 2013 was the total rebuild of Town line road. This road is shared with the Village of Port Edwards and the Town of Saratoga. The total cost of the rebuild was 2.2 million and Grand Rapids was responsible for 36% of this amount. A state Trip-D road grant was applied for and was granted with a state payment of \$877,151 towards the project costs, of this \$316,697 came back to the town. The Town has taken out a State Trust Fund loan in the amount of \$500,000 which will be paid back over the next five years.

July saw the retirement of our Chief of Police David Lewandowski. Our Police and Fire Commission selected Melvin Pedersen as our new Chief. Mel is originally from this area and is excited to be back home. Mel's last position was the Resident Agent in Charge-Supervisory Special Agent with DHS/ICE/Homeland Security investigations out of O'Hare Airport in Chicago. Mel is taking the philosophy of being a working Chief, so you will see him not only leading our Police Department but patrolling our town roads.

Winter has been tough on our Snow and Ice maintenance budget. We will need Mother Nature to cooperate this fall and winter to keep within budget. Several of you called me or the town offices with questions and or requests. I hope we were able to resolve all of your concerns.

February 2014 saw the retirement of James Eichhorn. Jim had 43+years working for our Maintenance Department. We wish him well in his retirement. He indicated he may be willing to part time snow plow for us next winter.

On March 31<sup>st</sup> we welcomed Jacob Bielmeier as Jim's replacement for our Maintenance Department.

### CHOOSE-TO-REUSE EVENTS OF 2014!!!!

Scheduled for 2014 will be two Choose to Re-Use events. Mark your calendars for Saturday May 17<sup>th</sup> and watch for posting of the date in August to attend this event. The Choose to Re-Use will take place from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m. at the Town Garage, 2811 Two Mile Ave.

Choose to Re-Use is an event where residents bring items in good working condition that they want to discard but that perhaps someone else can use. Or you may take any item that you can use. You don't have to bring items in order to take items away. The objective of Choose to Re-Use is simple: Reduce the amount of solid waste in our landfills.

Photos or descriptions of large items (sofas, chairs, etc.) along with contact information will be posted at the Town Garage. Items that have fees associated with them (e.g. refrigerators, microwaves, etc.) must be signed for and will be charged if no one chooses that item by the end of the day.

As of April 10, 2012 "Burn Barrels" are no longer allowed in the Town of Grand Rapids. Please check our Burning Ordinance (can be found on the town's website) for more information on burning within the town.

## GARBAGE AND RECYCLING INFORMATION

The Town of Grand Rapids contracts with Advanced Disposal for the roadside pickup of our garbage and recycling items. Our contract provides "curbside collection service for the collection of **not more than (4) 30 gallon bags or cans of residential waste** from residential units one time per week". Advanced Disposal is not required to pick up residential waste in excess of this amount. An excess of this allowed amount may result in some of your garbage not being picked up by Advanced Disposal. The resident is responsible for properly disposing of the excess amount.

Recycling items contracted to be picked up include: Consumer commingled materials such as aluminum cans, container glass, corrugated cardboard, mixed papers, newspapers, tin cans and **#1 through #7 plastic items and aseptic containers.**

NEW ITEMS!!!  
NOW ACCEPTED IN ADDITION TO #1 & #2'S

### #3 THROUGH #7 PLASTICS:



- Food & beverage containers, cat litter containers, ice cream pails, 5-gallon pails, medicine/pill containers, bakery containers, flower pots or trays, yogurt or cottage cheese containers, cups & tubs, clear and rigid clam shell packaging.

### ASEPTIC CONTAINERS:

- Cartons or boxes used for juice, milk, soy milk, ice cream and broths.



### PREPARATION:

- Empty and rinse all containers
  - Average or small-sized #3 through #7 plastic and aseptic items can be placed in your container along with other recyclables.
  - Large plastic items (>15 gal. containers, furniture items, toys, etc.) are NOT collected at curbside recycling. These items can be delivered to the Portage County Material Recovery Facility in Plover for recycling at no charge.

### PLASTICS NOT ACCEPTED

- #1 Brown plastic bottles
- #6 polystyrene foam ("Styrofoam"): Egg cartons, hot beverage cups, plates, formed packing pieces, packing peanuts.
- Motor oil containers
- Plastic film, shrink wrap and bags (all #'s)
- CD cases
- Vinyl items such as window, siding, etc.



### E-CYCLE

In October 2009 a law was put into place banning certain electronics from Wisconsin landfills and incinerators after September 1, 2010. With this law in place the manufacturers will be responsible for the cost of recycling the electronics. Businesses that collect the discarded electronics are still allowed to **charge a handling fee for collecting the items and transporting them to recyclers.** As of September 1, 2010 the following electronics are not allowed in landfills and will not be picked up by our contracted garbage and recycling hauler.
