RESOLUTION NO: 2017-24

Re: Ordinance No. 3 – Regulating Solid Waste and Recycling

The Town Board of the Town of Grand Rapids, Wood County, Wisconsin,
RESOLVES as follows:

Ordinance 3 – Regulating Solid Waste and Recycling is hereby amended as presented.

The Town Board of the Town of Grand Rapids, Wood County, Wisconsin, has the specific authority under Chapters 60 and 66 of Wisconsin Statutes, and specifically § 287.09, Wis. Stats. to amend this ordinance.

In order to add in language related to composting, revisions to be made to the following sections, resulting in all remaining items to be re-numbered accordingly:

3.4 Definitions

- G. Compost Bin: Means a receptacle designed to house and facilitate the decomposition of organic matter into compost through proper aeration and moisture retention.
- H. Composting: Means the controlled microbial decomposition of organic waste producing compost, a humus-like product used as a soil conditioner.

3.7 Disposal of Recyclables

- A. Yard waste shall be composted or transferred and deposited at an approved DNR site.
 - 1) The policy of the Town is to encourage home composting. All compost piles shall be maintained using approved composting procedures and shall comply with the requirements of sections 3.25 and 3.26 of this Ordinance.
 - 2) Yard waste will not be accepted at the transfer site for disposal. Such material shall be taken to a DNR approved site for composting, or yard waste may be composted on private property provided it is nuisance free, does not create offensive odors, and does not attract vermin or undesirable animals.

3.25 Composting

Home composting is encouraged by the Town. All compost piles on a lot zoned R-1 residential (one- and two-family), a lot zoned R-2 residential (one- and two-family), or R-2S residential (one-family) shall be maintained using Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources or United States Department of Agriculture published composting procedures, to comply with the following requirements:

- A. Compost piles shall be located in rear yard areas and screened from the view of neighbors living areas.
- B. All compost piles shall be enclosed in a free-standing compost bin. Each compost bin shall be no larger in volume than one hundred twenty-five (125) cubic feet, shall be no taller than forty-two (42) inches, and shall be securely covered to keep animals from accessing the compost pile.
- C. Compost bins shall be located no closer than nine (9) feet to a lot line, and not less than twenty-five (25) feet from a neighboring dwelling unit. Compost bins shall not be located within a drainage easement or floodway, or otherwise obstruct the flow of surface water.
- D. Compost materials shall be layered, aerated, moistened, turned and managed to promote effective decomposition of the materials in a safe, secure and sanitary manner. Compost materials shall be covered with

a layer of material such as leaves, straw, wood chips, or finished compost to reduce odor.

- E. All compost bins shall be maintained in a way to prevent the attraction or harborage of rodents and pests. The presence of rodents in or near a compost bin shall be cause for the Town to consider the compost bin a public nuisance and proceed to abate the nuisance.
- F. No compost bin shall be allowed to deteriorate to such condition as to be a blighting influence on the surrounding property or neighborhood or Town in general.

3.26 Composting Ingredients

A. No compost bin shall contain any of the following:

- 1) Cooked food scraps of any kind or type;
- 2) Fish, meat, bones or other animal products;
- 3) Oils or fats;
- 4) Dairy products;
- 5) Weeds gone to seed;
- 6) Whole branches or logs;
- 7) Charcoal briquette ash;
- 8) Manures;
- 9) Sawdust or ash from treated wood;
- 10) Large items that will impede the composting process.

B. Permitted ingredients in a compost bin shall include the following:

- 1) Grass clippings;
- 2) Leaves;
- 3) Straw;
- 4) Weeds and garden debris;
- 5) Small brush, twigs;
- 6) Vegetable and fruit peels, cores and trimmings;
- 7) Sawdust and wood chips;
- 8) Eggshells;
- 9) Coffee grounds, tea leaves and paper filters.

3.27 Enforcement

Any authorized officer, employee or representative of the Town may inspect recyclable materials separated for recycling; post-consumer waste intended for disposal; collection sites and facilities; composting area; collection vehicles; collection areas of multiple-family dwellings and non-residential facilities and properties; solid waste

disposal facilities and solid waste treatment facilities; and any records relating to recycling activities, for the purpose of ascertaining compliance with the provisions of this ordinance. No person may refuse access to any authorized officer, employee or authorized representative of the Town who requests access for the purpose of inspection, and who presents appropriate credentials. No person may obstruct, hamper, or interfere with such an inspection.

This ordinance amended by a majority of the town board with a quorum present and voting and proper notice having been given, amends the attached Ordinance 3 – Regulating Solid Waste and Recycling.
